Why Organization Matters

A disorganized craft room can impact many aspects of your crafting experience. Here are a few ways it puts a damper on the joy of creating:

Cluttered supplies mean you spend more time searching and less time creating.

When supplies are hard to find, crafting becomes a long and challenging process.

An overwhelmed space is an overwhelmed mind. Clearing the clutter can revamp your motivation to create and help you take back the joy of crafting.



First Steps

Take Inventory

The most important step to complete before reorganizing your supplies is to take an inventory of them. Take the time to create a list of all the supplies you have (yes, ALL of them), including their dimensions and quantities. Leave the "Storage Location" spaces blank until you've given each supply a home after organizing your space.

Purging & Donations

How to Purge Like a Pro (and Prep for Donation)

A cluttered space can block creativity—and purging is the first step to getting it back. Here's how to clear the excess and feel good about it.

1. Set the Stage

Choose a time when you can fully focus—no distractions, no pressure. Grab some empty boxes or bins and label them: Keep, Donate, Trash, and Unsure.

2. Start Small

Pick one drawer, bin, or category (like stamps or beads). Purging everything at once can be overwhelming, so work in short, focused bursts.

3. Be Honest

Ask yourself:

- Have I used this in the last year?
- Do I still like this style, color, or theme?
- Would I buy this again today?

If the answer is "no," it's probably time to let it go.



4. Let Go of Guilt

Just because it was expensive or gifted doesn't mean it has to stay. Your space should reflect your current creativity—not past purchases.

5. Prep for Donation

Before donating:

- Bundle like items (paper stacks, embellishments, tools)
- Label gently used supplies if helpful
- Wipe down or gently clean items
- Find a local school, church group, or creative nonprofit that accepts donations

6. Keep the Momentum

Schedule regular mini-purges to stay ahead of clutter. And remember—every item you donate gives someone else a chance to create something beautiful.

Create a Workflow

#1 Identify Your Supplies

Look around your craft room and make a mental (or written) inventory of your supplies. Whether you're into card making, sewing, or other hobbies, get a clear idea of the types and quantities of materials you own.

#3 Create Zones

Now that you know your supplies and workflow, organize your space into zones—for example, a cutting zone, stamping zone, or assembly zone. Each zone should match a step in your process and keep the tools for that task nearby. This keeps your workflow smooth, reduces mistakes, and saves time hunting for supplies.

#2 Understand Your Process

Every craft follows a process—like gathering supplies, cutting, decorating, and finishing. Think through the typical steps you follow from start to finish. Even if your projects vary, the core workflow usually stays the same.

#4 Utilize Storage Solutions

Having zones is great, but they only work if your supplies are stored in an organized way. Utilize items such as cabinets, trays, crates, and wall storage to keep everything tidy and easily accessible.

Plan Your Craft Room Layout

Get ready to bring your dream craft room to life! This printable lets you map out your space, place your storage, create an organized, inspiring workspace—all before moving a single cabinet!

How It Works: Step 1: Prep Your Space

- · Print out both pages of this printable—one with the grid and one with the storage
- cabinets.
 Grab some scissors, a pen or pencil, and your imagination!

Step 2: Draw Your Room Layout

- Use the grid page to sketch out your room—each square represents one foot. The grid supports rooms up to 12x12 feet in size. For larger rooms, cut out the grid and tape two together.
- · Mark key features like walls, windows, doors, closets, and outlets with a marker or pen.

Step 3: Cut & Arrange Your Storage

- · Carefully cut out the Best Craft Organizer cabinets and Craft Island from the second
- page.
 - Place them on your grid to experiment with different layouts. Move them around until everything fits perfectly!

Step 4: Make It Work for You

- Does your setup leave enough room to move around comfortably?
- Are your most-used supplies easy to reach?
- Do you have enough storage for all your craft supplies?
- Do you prefer desk height, counter height, or bar height for your work areas and stations?

Step 5: Start Creating!








Craft Island




Extra Tips

Crafty Corner


This layout example demonstrates how to make space for your craft supplies when you have only a corner of a room to work with. This layout maximizes your storage potential without feeling cluttered.



Shared Space


Does your craft space live in a spare bedroom? If so, this layout will help you visualize how to arrange your furniture to create a cozy and cohesive room.
